The Division of Physical Therapy is seeking to fill two faculty positions, either of which can be tenure or non-tenure track. Both are nine-month faculty positions.

Tenure/Non-tenure candidate (Log#: 11-005, PVA#:58569):

Non-tenure candidate: Candidate must be a licensed physical therapist with a minimum of 5 years clinical experience. Primary responsibility involves teaching in the entry-level DPT curriculum. Candidates with adult neurorehabilitation and/or geriatric rehabilitation experience preferred. Candidate will also engage in scholarly activities, advise students, provide service to the department, college, and university and participate in professional activities.

Tenure candidate: Candidate should be a licensed physical therapist with a doctoral degree (PhD preferred) and University teaching, research, and clinical experience. The qualified applicant will have a demonstrated area of expertise in teaching and research, and be eligible to practice in Georgia, with a minimum of 5 years clinical experience. The successful candidate will engage in scholarly activities, advise students, direct graduate student research, provide service to the department, college, and university, and participate in professional activities. Salary and rank are commensurate with qualifications and experience

Non-tenure candidate(Log# 11 - 021, PVA#: 58652):Candidate must be a licensed physical therapist with a minimum of 5 years clinical experience. Primary responsibility involves teaching in the entry-level DPT curriculum. Candidates with musculoskeletal/orthopedic experience preferred. Candidate will also engage in scholarly activities, advise students, provide service to the department, college, and university and participate in professional activities

Tenure candidate(Log# 11 - 022, PVA#: 58653): Candidate should be a licensed physical therapist with a doctoral degree (PhD preferred) and University teaching, research, and clinical experience. The qualified applicant will have a demonstrated area of expertise in teaching and research, and be eligible to practice in Georgia, with a minimum of 5 years clinical experience. The successful candidate will engage in scholarly activities, advise students, direct graduate student research, provide service to the department, college, and university, and participate in professional activities. Salary and rank are commensurate with qualifications and experience

Appointment date will be January 2010. Positions are open until filled. Review of applications will begin September 2009.
