**Associate Director for Operations, Project Healthy Grandparents
Clinical Assistant Professor, School of Social Work**

Georgia State University School of Social Work in Atlanta, GA invites applications for a full-time position to work with Project Healthy Grandparents, an intergenerational service program for grandparents raising their grandchildren in the Atlanta metropolitan area, and to teach in the undergraduate program in the School of Social Work.

Primary Duties: Manage/monitor the day to day activities of Project Healthy Grandparents (PHG), including serving as the primary supervisor for the Community Partnerships Coordinator, Nursing Coordinator, Early Intervention Specialist, social work staff, and administrative assistants, prepare administrative reports for various funding sources that support the program, develop annual proposals to selected funding sources (e.g., United Way, GA Department of Human Resources, other nonfederal sources), and provide oversight for special events (e.g., Grandparents Luncheon, Holiday Event for PHG families).

As a Clinical Assistant Professor teach two courses in the BSW or MSW programs during the academic year. Applicants able to teach from a multi-methods approach (e.g., traditional classroom, online, or combination) are encouraged to apply.

Qualifications: Applicants must have a MSW; 3-5 years post masters practice experience preferred; experience managing social services for older adults and or children/youth desirable.

Campus and School: With more than 28,000 students, Georgia State University is a dynamic campus and one of the Southeast's largest urban universities. It is ideally situated in the heart of downtown Atlanta and is within easy access to the State Capitol, the Martin Luther King, Jr. Center, the Jimmy Carter Library, state and federal agencies and a vast array of community agencies. Attracting a mix of local, national, and international students, GSU is the most diverse college campus in Georgia. Within the School of Social Work, the BSW program graduates about 80 students per year. The MSW program, with a sole concentration on community partnerships, graduates 30-40 students per year. Both programs are accredited through 2012.
