

TESTING INFORMATION

The examination consists of multiple-choice questions, so you will not have to write any of your answers. You will find some of the questions easy, because you have learned the content in school or had some other opportunity. Each test item will have one correct answer. Do not be discouraged if you do not know the answer to every question. You will not be expected to get all the test items correct in the time given to complete the exam.

You will be asked to provide certain gender and ethnic information about yourself on the registration form. If you choose to provide this information, it will be treated anonymously and used for research purposes only. ERI uses this information to inspect the test for gender and/or ethnic bias studies.

TESTING CONDUCT

Giving, receiving, or exchanging information about the examination while it is in progress is not permitted under any circumstances, nor are examinees permitted to refer to materials of any kind during the test session. Examinees may not use calculators, or any other electronic equipment during testing. The examiner or proctor is instructed to terminate the examination for any individual not following these procedures and appropriate test behaviors.

TAKING THE EXAMINATION

Be sure to take your Examination Permit to the test site. One form of identification must be used for admission to the test. This can be a photo ID, such as a driver's license, a passport or an identification card.

YOU WILL NOT BE ADMITTED TO THE EXAM WITHOUT A PHOTO ID AND AN EXAMINATION PERMIT.

SPECIAL TESTING SITUATIONS

If a physical handicap, or learning disability, prevents you from taking the Nurse Entrance Test under standard conditions, you may request a special testing environment. You must inform ERI of this request at least eight weeks prior to the test date to receive these special arrangements.

Call ERI's Registrar at 1-800-292-2273 to make these arrangements. *A statement from a medical doctor or a school psychologist, as appropriate, attesting to the special need and a short letter, specifying the desired testing conditions must be sent to ERI. ANY VARIATION IN ARRANGEMENTS MUST BE CONFIRMED IN WRITING.*

PASSING AND FAILING

The school to which you apply may set its own standards for evaluating applicants; ERI is not involved in this procedure, nor does ERI establish the "passing" or "failing" mark on the examination. Test results show how your scores compare with those of other applicants who have taken this examination. The school to which you are applying will consider other factors besides test results in deciding on the admission of applicants.

TESTING FEE REFUND

No refund will be issued for any service associated with the Nurse Entrance Test of Educational Resources, Inc., under any circumstances. If you miss the Nurse Entrance Test, you may reschedule the test by calling ERI and completing another registration and paying the applicable fees.

CANCELLATION NOTICE

In the extremely rare event that a test session is cancelled, you will be notified of an alternate testing date.

ABOUT THE NET

The Nurse Entrance Test (NET) was developed by Educational Resources, Inc. (ERI) to assist schools of nursing in the guidance and placement of applicants seeking to become nurses. The **NET** evaluates basic reading comprehension and math skills that you have mastered up to this time. Most of the questions on this entrance test deal with subjects you have studied in school, while other questions are concerned with the application of knowledge in everyday living. The questions have been reviewed by persons who were not involved with the test development process to ensure that the questions are not discriminatory with respect to race, ethnicity, linguistic background, or gender.

The **NET** has two important sections that generate your entrance scores: a reading section and a math section. Both sections have time limits.

The reading section will evaluate some of the reading skills you have developed in and out of school. The reading selections will evaluate your reading comprehension with a variety of topics, followed by multiple choice questions about what you have read.

The greater majority of the mathematics items require you to add, subtract, multiply and divide whole numbers, decimals, fractions and integers. A few items will involve percentages and very basic algebra. The test items have multiple choice answers.

APPLYING TO TAKE THE EXAMINATION

To register for the **NET**, call Educational Resources, Inc. at 1-800-292-2273 and ask for the Registrar. You cannot register for this test online or by mail.

DEADLINE DATES

Your Registration Fees must be paid at the time of registration. You may pay by credit or debit card only. You must call ERI to register and pay at least 14 days prior to the date on which you wish to take the examination. The Registrar will give you the registration deadline dates in the city in which you are interested in taking the **NET**. If you fail to register and pay the applicable fees by this deadline date, a additional late fee of \$10.00 must be paid. Registration is not permitted 8 days or less prior to your requested examination date.

***** NOTICE *****

You will not be permitted to register for any regularly scheduled examination by simply showing up on the day of the examination.


EXAM PERMIT


You will receive an exam permit by mail, once you have completed your registration by phone and paid the applicable fees.

DELIVERY OF YOUR SCORE REPORT

You may expect the nursing program of your choice to receive your score report approximately one (1) week after your testing date.

IMPORTANT REGISTRATION INFORMATION

 If you registered for the **NET** and notify ERI, in writing, that you will be unable to take the test, you will be registered for the next available date, at the test site you have already chosen, at no charge to you. There will be no charge for rescheduling before the testing date has passed. However, if you wait until the testing date has passed to re-register for an alternate location and/or date choice, your original test fee is forfeited and will not be refunded to you. You must again call ERI to complete a new registration and pay the test fees.

 The request for rescheduling, along with your original Examination Permit, needs to reach Educational Resources, Inc. (ERI), at least 7 days before the new date on which you wish to take the examination. A new Examination Permit will be sent to you. If you have not received your new Examination Permit one week prior to the testing date you requested, call ERI's Registrar at 1-800-292-2273, between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday through Thursday (between 8 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. on Fridays), Central Standard Time. Collect calls will not be accepted.

PREPARING FOR TESTING

You should plan to arrive at the testing location by the time indicated on your Examination Permit. You will not be admitted to the examination if you arrive late. The test session will last about three (3) hours, including preparation and actual testing. There will be short breaks during the test session. During the examination, you will not be permitted to receive messages or have persons wait for you in the examination room.
